
# PUBLIC REVIEW AND COMMENT PERIOD

Prior to department approval of the planning agreement, the public shall have 21 calendar days to review and comment on the proposed planning agreement.

Comments received on or before

December 6, 2022 will be reviewed.

## Considerations for Defining Boundaries

- No minimum or maximum size for an HCP; NCCP requires regional scale plan
- Existing boundaries meaningful to the plan:
  - Political boundaries
  - Land ownership boundaries
  - Physical and ecological boundaries
- Where do covered activities occur?
- Permit area must include:
  - Entire footprint of covered activities and associated areas of direct and indirect impact
  - All potential mitigation sites
- Defining boundaries is iterative throughout plan development



#### HCP Plan Area

Comprised of all areas that will be used for any activities described in the HCP, including covered activities and the conservation program.

Includes all lands necessary for the HCP to be fully implemented.

Must at a minimum include the permit area, but often includes lands outside of the permit area.

Must be clearly delineated in the HCP with a map and written description.

May also be called HCP area, study area, or planning area.



NCCP Planning Area



The geographic area to be addressed in the Plan is referred to as the *planning* area.



Defined in the Planning Agreement.



Must be of sufficient size to address the NCCP Act requirement of conservation at the landscape or ecosystem scale.

# Proposed SBCCP Planning Area

- The County of San Benito
- Proposed Planning Area is 890,604 acres



#### Permit Area


Geographic area where the impacts of the covered activities occur for which incidental take permit coverage is requested.

No minimum permit area size.

Must be within the plan area and under control of the permittee or holder of a certificate of inclusion.

Must be clearly delineated with a map and written description in the HCP and the incidental take permit.





# Proposed Permit Area

- All unincorporated lands within San Benito County, excluding lands owned or managed by Tribal, local, state, or federal governments and other protected lands.
- Proposed permit area is 769,080 acres.
- Lands currently not considered in permit area
  - Cities of Hollister and San Juan Bautista
  - Pinnacles NP
  - Fremont Peak SP
  - BLMS areas
  - CA State Lands Commission areas
  - Hollister Hills SVRA
  - San Justo Reservoir
  - Pajaro River Mitigation Bank
  - Gonzalez Farm
  - Rancho Larios OSP
  - Rocks Ranch






# What is ICF Waypoint?

**ICF Waypoint** is a cost- and timeefficient web-based toolkit utilized by project teams, stakeholders and clients across the country to:

- Facilitate data sharing and visualization needs between the client, consultant team, and other stakeholders;
- Support field work, analytical result presentation, automated analysis and reporting; and
- Integrate public facing content to provide stakeholder resources and engagement tools.



Hours of data management services are typically saved over the course of a year when utilizing WayPoint tools.

- Compiling list of all potential covered activities
- Outreach to other potential plan participants
- Refining list of activities to include in plan
