4. PUBLIC COMMENT ON ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA

One Public Comment via Zoom, Supervisor Bea Gonzales, made a comment if someone from the Pacheco Storm Water District committee to attend the Cal OES meetings. Second item Bea Gonzales asked if there was a contact number other than county council number for public to contact the board. Third item is related to Dunneville/ Lovers Lane area a lot of people are reliant on internet. Bea Gonzales wanted to know if the Board of Supervisors/County could post a bulletin board near Dunneville market to update the public in the area.

One Public Comment in Chambers, Lucinda Florek, agreed with what Supervisor Bea Gonzales said in regard to a bulletin board getting posted.

5. CONSENT AGENDA

5.A Approval of Minutes of Meeting of March 13, 2023 Joel Ellinwood, Assistant County Counsel advised the minutes will be finalized and included in the agenda packet for the next meeting. Meeting minutes for March, 13,2023 will be included in this meetings minutes. This agenda item will be moved to the next meeting.

6. REGULAR AGENDA

6.A Update regarding FEMA Application for Emergency Public Assistance to Repair Pacheco Creek Levee Breaks

Madison Mitchell, San Benito County OES staff advised she is supporting county staff with public assistance application for FEMA. Currently we are waiting for Cal OES and FEMA to establish that we are an eligible entity.

Paula Azcona, Trustee asked what is the maximum amount they are going to offer us.

Steve Loupe, Director of Public Works commented staff is submitting a request for \$2M dollars for the levy repair and half a million dollars for the creek clean up.

One Public Comment via Zoom, Yareny Jones asked who pays for the 6% cost share.

Steve Loupe, Director of Public Works stated as Madison mentioned, we are trying to work that all out. First FEMA needs to confirm our documents are in order, and then they will setup a meeting. The next step is to request the funds and then finally we have to coordinate internally and externally who will pay for those funds. The first step is to apply to see if we receive any funds. If we decide to move forward all of us need to determine who pays that 6% because we understand the district is financially constrained.

Armando Alfaro, Trustee, asked once we receive the funds, when can we start the repairs.

Steve Loupe, Director of Public Works, advised after we receive the funding or determine that we're going to move forward we will be able to clean up the creek fairly soon.

6.B Update regarding Additional Funding Opportunities for District Flood Recovery and Future Flood Control Improvements

Steve Loupe, Director of Public Works provided an update regarding additional funding opportunities.

Paula Azcona, Trustee asked how soon the \$40K grant will be available.

Steve Loupe, Director of Public Works advised the time frame is unknown.

No Public Comment via Zoom.

No Public Comment in the chambers.

One Public Comment in Chambers, Yareny Jones, asked about agriculture and if this grant is for farmers only.

Joel Ellinwood, Assistant County Counsel stated we don't know what the criteria are, this is a new program.

6.C Appointment of Clerk for District Board of Trustees

Michele Schroeder, Trustee asked if anyone had any questions about the appointment of the clerk.

Paula Azcona, Trustee asked how soon do they need to decide on the clerk for the District Board of Trustees.

Joel Ellinwood, Assistant County Counsel replied for the time being county staff is performing the function for the district but ultimately it would be appropriate to have someone perform that function for the district directly.

Michele Schroeder, Trustee asked Joel Ellinwood, Assistant County Counsel if he had a suggestion.

Joel Ellinwood, Assistant County Counsel made the suggestion to advertise for people who might be interested in serving on a voluntary or compensation basis.

One Public Comment via Zoom, Micah Jones asked where the money is coming from. Is it coming from the county or is it coming out of the storm district.

Joel Ellinwood, Assistant County Counsel advised the Storm Water Disctrcit has an account with the county with approximately \$50K in it.

No Public Comment via Zoom.

No Public Comment in the chambers.

6.D Appointment of Advisory Board or Committee for District Board of Trustees Joel Ellinwood, Assistant County Counsel, commented there were quite a number of people who attended the initial informational meeting about the reorganization of the district. Some of whom had a lot of information, there are landowners in the district not eligible to serve on the board because they don't live there. Joel stated It might be helpful to have a role for those kinds of people to play both, provide information and make recommendations to the Board of Trustees as to what actions might be taken.

Michele Schroeder, Trustee asked if there is a fair amount of latitude in terms of creating this committee.

Armando Alfaro, Trustee, had a comment about the people who have lived in Hollister over 30 years and have a lot of knowledge about the area, but they don't live near the creek, so they aren't able to be on the committee.

Joel Ellinwood, Assistant County Counsel, stated the advisory committee members don't have to live in the district or even necessarily own land in the district as long as they have a background check that would be useful.

No Public Comment via Zoom.

No Public Comment in the chambers.

6.E Discussion of Process for Appointment of Additional Trustees to District Board of Trustees

Joel Ellinwood, Assistant County Counsel, advised section 6.6 of the Stormwater District Act of 1909 provides that not less than 120 days before the General District Election the Board of Trustees may, by resolution increase the number of trustees to serve on the board to 5 and may designate the first additional trustees to serve on the enlarged board.

Paula Azcona, Trustee, said having 5 trustees is fine, but we need participation in the chambers.

Michele Schroeder, Trustee, commented there was a sense of urgency when they were appointed and most of it had to do with getting the FEMA application in. Michele said she keeps hearing that people want to get things done, and if there are only 3 trustees it may be easier to get things done, at first.

One Public Comment in the Chambers, Dom Zanger, Supervisor commented he would keep it at 3 and move on the Advisory Committee Board situation.

One Public Comment in the Chambers, Lucinda Florek stated her family and her husband's family have lived on Lovers Lane for over 100 years. Lucinda said the only reason they didn't volunteer to help was because they were out of town that weekend but she would like to offer her help.

One Public Comment in the Chambers, Bill Florek said a lot of his frustration is how things come and go. Bill would like to create a long term solution for the creek.

One Public Comment via Zoom, Yareny Jones made the comment that she agrees 3 trustees would be best for the time being.

No Public Comment via Zoom.

No Public Comment in the chambers.

6.F Consider establishing monthly creek clean up days sponsored by the District.

Armando Alfaro, Trustee, advised we need to clean the creek before the rain. Armando recommends a creek clean up every 3 months in order to prevent damage.

Michele Schroeder, Trustee asked Steve Loupe, Director of Public Works what can we do without a permit.

Steve Loupe, Director of Public Works responded by saying garbage and debris can be cleaned out of the creeks. Anything that is loose or anything that is going to present a life safety hazard, you can remove that obstruction from the waterway.

Michele Schroeder, Trustee commented that if its not loose and brush growing into the creek bed, does it require a permit.

Steve Loupe, Director of Public Works replied correct.

Michele Schroeder, Trustee asked if a clean up day would be useful.

Steve Loupe, Director of Public Works, said yes it would be beneficial.

One Public Comment via Zoom, Yareny Jones made a comment about having a monthly clean up as she believes it is more of a preventative measure. Yareny believes we should invest the money from FEMA or grants in getting the major cleanup done first. Yareny made the suggestion to have a community clean up. Yareny asked if we were to hold a monthly clean up, how would it be picked up and properly disposed of.

Steve Loupe, Director of Public Works, advised we would need to coordinate with CHEER.

Paula Azcona, Trustee, commented monthly clean-up is a bit extreme, during the wet seasons we can't have people walking on the levees and then there is the erosion part of it. Paula recommended we clean up at the end of the summer or fall months.

One Public Comment via Zoom, Micah Jones said he is confused about the cleanup of creeks because if we can clean it up, why didn't we do it before all the flooding happened. Micah was told by Fish and Wildlife they did not allow the county to go clean things up.

One Public Comment via Zoom, Yareny Jones stated she wanted to clarify that the monthly cleanup she proposed is not monthly from the beginning of the year to the end. Yareny Jones meant during the time of the rain season.

Steve Loupe, Director of Public Works, said if a farmer has a very large excavator and can go on the bridge and move debris that is blocking the bridge from flowing properly Fish and Wildlife will allow that to occur. For larger equipment and larger activities we will likely need some funding.

6.G Mosquito Abatement of continuing standing water from flooding and ponding due to saturated soils

Armando Alfaro, Trustee, has noticed in the last 2 weeks there have been a lot of mosquitoes in the area. Armando says this is a big problem and if nothing gets done it will become very dangerous.

Michele Schroeder, Trustee, asked what authority we have as a district to address this issue.

Joel Ellinwood, Assistant County Counsel, advised the county has a mosquito abatement program. It is administered through the Agricultural Commissioner's Office. Joel recommends that the District contact the Agricultural Commissioner's office and have their personal who operate the mosquito abatement to come out and give them a tour of where the standing water is, and they can treat it appropriately.

Paula Azcona, Trustee, had a comment about the ponds and how some may be organic, and they may not want to be fumigated.

One Public Comment in the Chambers, Josephine Alfaro, also commented on the mosquitoes and she says there are a lot of mosquitoes. Josephine has a tarp with a mosquito infestation along with the smell of the water. Josephine believes this is an issue for livestock, plants and for humans.

One Public Comment in the Chambers, Yareny Jones, commented that the water they are referring to is the water that was brushed up that is already contaminated by the floods.

Michele Schroeder, Trustee, asked Joel Ellinwood for the contact information for the Ag Commissioner and was advised his name is Ken Griffin and the information is on the county's website.

Moved by Paula Azcona; seconded by Michele Schroeder to Approve Motion to contact the Ag Commissioner and ask them to come out and make an inspection and propose mosquito abatement control. .

1.B INFORMATIONAL PRESENTATION ON PUBLIC AGENCIES WITH PROGRAM AND FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES FOR DISTRICT FLOOD RECOVERY AND FUTURE FLOOD CONTROL IMPROVEMENTS

Steve Loupe, Director of Public Works provided a presentation on the funding opportunities and sources that are going to be available to the Pacheco Storm Water District.

Steve Loupe, Director of Public Works commented Staff would suggest, after we request funding for the levee and the creek, Staff recommends the request for funding the hydraulic study of the area so we can see how much water is coming into the creek and area.

One Public Comment in Chambers, Elia Salinas, asked Steve Loupe, Director of Public Works, what is the distance the Pacheco Storm Water District covers.

Joel Ellinwood, Assistant County Counsel responded by stating the district is about 1,400 acres. There is a map that has been previously provided, it encompasses 66 different parcels, 5 of which are owned by the United States Department of the Interior. The district has easements of record that were granted by property owners to construct and maintain the levees that includes parcels owned by trustee.

Steve Loupe, Director of Public Works stated there will be a webpage created where documents will be posted.

One Public Comment via Zoom, Micah Jones asked about the \$2 million dollars to fix and clean out the creek and do a study. Micah asked what the \$2 million dollars will actually get us. The second question was do we have to deal with FEMA to clean up the creek.

Joel Ellinwood, Assistant County Counsel commented we have the right but we do not have the resources. Currently, we are looking for funding to make the repairs and to clean out the stream channel to reduce the risk of flooding in the future.

Steve Loupe, Director of Public Works added when staff met with FEMA, staff requested funding to repair the levee and clean up the creek. FEMA asked if the County has an easement or ownership rights to that area. Our response was no and so FEMA said sorry you cannot apply for funding over areas that you don't have any rights to. Now that the Pacheco Storm Water District has become active, and this district has easement rights over this area that provides a mechanism to apply for funding we can begin the process. The \$2 million would focus on construction and the 2 levee breaches that we know there, slightly upstream of the area that was fixed previously.

Review mapping of easements held by the District for flood control facilities.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY:

Pacheco Storm Water District holds easements granted in 1948 and 1985 on parcels in the vicinity of Pacheco Creek as described in documents of record that are binding on all successor owners. The legal descriptions of the easements are difficult to interpret. The mapping professionals in the San Benito County Assessor's Office prepared maps illustrating the areas described in the easements, The maps and an overlay of the maps on an aerial view of the district and the levees as mapped by FEMA Flood Maps are attached.

Some portions of the levees were constructed on properties for which there are no current easements of record. Fortunately that does not include portions of the levee that failed in either 2017 or 2023. However, it would be advantageous to secure easements that include the entire levee system and the areas within the levees for future maintenance and debris removal purposes.

The form of easement as utilized by the District in 1985 could serve as a template for obtaining easements for additional areas from current landowners, perhaps with modifications. A draft based on the 1985 form is attached for review and consideration for presentation to appropriate property owners.

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY:

California Government Code section 87300 mandates that all local public agencies adopt a Conflict of Interest Code which must specifically list the positions within the agency that must file Form 700 Statement of Economic Interest. No Conflict of Interest Code shall be effective until it has been approved by the code reviewing body, which for multi-county agencies, such as the Pacheco Storm Water District which includes portions of Santa Clara and San Benito Counties, is the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) (otherwise a County Board of Supervisors). A new agency has 6 months to submit a code. Once the PSWD Code is approved by the FPPC, the persons specified in the approved code must file the Form 700 Statement of Economic Interests with the appropriate agency.

A draft Resolution to adopt the model state Conflict of Interest Code by reference is attached.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE PACHECO STORM WATER DISTRICT ADOPTING A CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE.

WHEREAS, the Political Reform Act, Government Code Section 81000, et seq., requires every state or local government agency to adopt and promulgate a conflict of interest code; and

WHEREAS, the Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation, 2 Cal. Code of Regulations, Section 18730, which contains the terms of a standard model conflict of interest code, which can be incorporated by reference, and which will be amended to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act after public notice and hearings conducted by the Fair Political Practices Commission pursuant to the Administrative Procedure Act, Government Code Sections 11370, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Pacheco Storm Water District Board of Trustees desires to adopt the Fair Political Practices Commission's model conflict of interest code; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code section 87302, the conflict of interest code must designate positions and advisory bodies subject to disclosure of financial interests; and

WHEREAS, the board determines that the members of the Board of Trustees and of any Advisory Committee which may be hereinafter established, and any compensated staff that may hereinafter may be employed or engaged as independent contractors or consultants are those positions and advisory bodies which should be designated and all the the categories of financial interests which should be made reportable.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the terms of 2 Cal. Code of Regulations Section 1873O, any later amendments duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, and the above-specified officials, employees and members of the advisory bodies of the Pacheco Storm Water District Board of Trustees are designated and disclosure categories as are set forth above is hereby incorporated by reference and constitutes the conflict of interest code of the Pacheco Storm Water District Board of Trustees and of the officials, employees and members of advisory bodies specified above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT persons holding the positions or who are members of the advisory bodies designated shall file statements of economic interests pursuant to Section 4(C) of the code with the San Benito County Clerk, to whom the Pacheco Storm Water District Board of Trustees hereby delegates the authority to carry out the duties of filing officer.
