#### d. Public Comment

Shawn Tennabaum, San Benito High School Superintendent, thanked the Board for their leadership. He said that the collaborate efforts that the Board has shown and CAO Espinosa has been tremendous for the High School. He said that we have been able to accomplish so much with collaborate efforts from safety of our students to building a road a temporary closing road and steps moving forward with the closing of Nash Road and a future parking lot. He said on behalf of the San Benito High School District we are here to say thank you. He said that those efforts mean everything to them as we strive to have the safest environment possible for our staff and students. He said that he and Roseann would like to present a check in the amount of \$394,000 dollars for their portion of the project to the CAO Ray Espinosa for the County of San Benito to help move forward in the continuous efforts.

Roseann, Chief Business Officer, said that she would like to echo Chief Tennabaums feelings about our gratefulness and the safety of our employee's and students. She said I appreciate everything and thank you all.

Supervisor Anthony Botelho said working on the committee for the Nash Road we were able to get a lot done. He thanked Mr. Tennabaum.

CAO Ray Espinosa thanked Mr. Tennabaum and his team for the time and energy put forth.

#### e. Department Head Announcements: Information Only

Kris Mangano, Interim OES Director provided an update on the power outages that P.G.&E. has been broadcasting the last few days. She said as of this morning at 7:30 a.m. San Benito County is not on the blueprint to be affected. She said we are expecting winds which could cause some shut downs but not because of the fires. She said that she would continue to keep the Board updated if there are any changes.

Supervisor Peter Hernandez asked if there was a map of the places being affected, in addition to notifying the County.

Ms. Mangano said that P.G.& E. does have a map on their website; pge.com. that is current and up to date. She said that if there is an outage due to the wildfires they would contact each customer

affected.

Supervisor Anthony Botelho said that he hopes that next year we can address mowing in some of those potential fire areas. Maybe OES can work with RMA on this. We need to address how we mow as it is a concern to several residents.

Ms. Mangano said that she would work with RMA on that.

Supervisor Jim Gillio said that you can also put in your address on the website to see if your address would be affected by the power outages.

Supervisor Jaime De La Cruz asked if this was going to be an on going thing.

Ms. Mangano replied probably because this is a new program of theirs.

RMA Director Harry Mavrogenes introduced some new employees and promotions in his department: Maria Aldape, Secretary; Megan Stevens, Staff Specialist; Arielle Goodspeed, Planner; Duane Dauphine, Chief Building Official; Kathy Smallwood, County Technician; Rich Brown a retiree working in Code Enforcement 3 days a week. He said that there has been 11 recruitment's and are interviewing for road maintenance supervisor's. Have an accountant I position open which we will be interviewing for next week. He said that we are working on getting a full department.

CAO Ray Espinosa stated we are removing Item #3 from consent agenda will be bringing back at a later date. Met with Assemblyman and discussed Highway 25 and the roundabout concerns along with Supervisor Botelho and Gillio.

#### f. Board Announcements: Information Only

Supervisor Jaime De La Cruz reported that he attended RCRC Conference and that they generated \$900.00 to help out a non profit, FFA for that particular County, on the basket that was put together for a raffle.

Supervisor Peter Hernandez reported that he attended RCRC Conference in Lake Tahoe and sat through different session one being Economic Development. Sat down with lobbyist in regards to roundabout. Reported that he had a productive Vet's Commission meeting yesterday pertaining to Vet's Park.

Supervisor Anthony Botelho said that he had a correspondence from a person in regards to an issue with odors on Hemp. He said I think it is something that we need to take a look at at the end of the growing season and evaluate our ordinance. He said that it has been a privilege for me to be on the Board these years to help promote economic development. He said that he is concerned and somewhat disappointed in regards to the area on the 101 corridor that this is such a controversy right now. He said that I feel that people are very misguided and putting out falsehoods to get signatures for a referendum to put this on the ballot. He said this is going to cost the County a lot of money. We want the public to be involved in these projects but they are going about it the wrong way. He said that I would like to have an estimate possibly at the next meeting what the cost would be to the taxpayers to put this on the ballot.

Supervisor Jim Gillio commented on the San Benito County Fair, gave Dara Tobias and the entire fair board credit and the community, it was amazing and well attended. He spoke on Supervisor De

La Cruz's question on funding on SB1. He said that SB277 has still not been signed by the governor which will reallocate how SB1 funds are allocated. He said that smaller counties would get less funding.

Supervisor Jim Gillio said that he would support this today, staff and our Planning Commission did a good job on this.

Supervisor Jaime De La Cruz said that he had a question in regards to in lieu of fees for habitat conservation, but does not see anything about low income housing.

RMA Director Harry Mavrogenes provided information to the Measure G Quick Start Road Improvements Projects Program and the sue of the Enterprise Fund to improve road segments on

Fairview Road. He said that they will bring projects back for specific review before they begin.

Budget Officer Stewart Patri provided a hand out which highlighted SB1 second table which outlines potential SB1 funding. He said that the first table outlines all of the road projects including the two projects that would be added today for Measure G and local road projects, which is part of the enterprise fund. The local road projects item includes the Best Road project, John Smith Road project, the quick pothole project that the Board approved this year as well as this new 3 million dollar Fairview project. He spoke about the Highway Bridge projects we have a 60.5 million dollar cost estimate on the 8 bridges, we have funding secured by the State in the amount of 54 million, we have a short fall of about 5 million.

Supervisor Anthony Botelho asked how are we going to address the bridge projects. These projects were recommended by CalTrans for Fema.

CAO Ray Espinosa provided additional information.

Greg Bucknell provided information to the Hospital Road Bridge.

Supervisor Jim Gillio thanked our team for putting this together. Would like to see if impact fees could be used for that bridge. We need to make a decision whether we want to move forward with the John Smith Road realignment or not. He said in regards to the potholing it has been a major concern in our community. The patches will at least get us through the winter.

Supervisor Peter Hernandez spoke about educating the public on what we are working on.

Supervisor Jaime De La Cruz commended staff for the report. He said that we need to take it one step further, if this gets approved today we need to put something on social media letting them know what we did and why.

Chairman Mark Medina said that he too would like to do something about the John Smith realignment, either we continue or scrap it. He said that the money we have in the enterprise fund needs to be used for these roads. He wanted to know what has to be done.

CAO Ray Espinosa said that you would need to give us direction to come back at the next Board meeting with a staff report to redirect those enterprise funds to a throughway, Fairview Road, John Smith Road, if your Board so chooses.

Supervisor Anthony Botelho said that he appreciates this list but he also is concerned about a few of the other roads that are deteriorating, if we could utilize enterprise funds for some of those impacts. We need to look at future funding from business licenses, etc. He said that we also have an obligation to our County Employees also.

Supervisor Gillio said that he would also like a report back on the Cienega Road realignment as far as what would the cost be and when it could possibly be done.

Supervisor Hernandez thanked staff for this list. He said that Fairview and Fallon road is a concern also for safety.

Chairman Mark Medina asked are we coming back on October 22nd with a list of funding and roads out of enterprise funds.

CAO Espinosa said that if it is the wish of the Board we would work with RMA on that and bring

it back on October 22nd.

Wayne Norton spoke about the Rocks Road Bridge and how it needs to be fixed. He said if we loose that bridge we have a very significant issue for safety to get to Carr Avenue.

#### 16. LONG TERM CARE COMMISSION

Receive update and report from the Commission. SBC FILE NUMBER: 156

Mitch Matthews 2019 Chair of the Long Term Care Commission provided information on the Long Term Care Commission in San Benito County and what their role is.

Clay Kemp, Executive Director of the Senior Council for San Benito County, gave an update on the 2019 State Legislative Bills and how it is going to affect San Benito County. He highlighted some of the updates: Funding success that we had, Statewide we brought in \$17.5 million for senior nutrition programs (\$60,000 for San Benito County); Caregiver Resource Center and Long Term Ombudsman received additional funding; MSSP program was approved but there was no expansion to add to services in San Benito County; Legislation SB611 required the Master Plan on Aging to include housing for older adults and people with disabilities. He said a couple of other things that are not in the report is that there is funding for a pilot program which we can work with hospitals. He said that they are looking at age friendly communities and aging disability resources. He said they continue to be active as a Commission and through our statewide commission. He said that the Governor has put together a committee for aging and is happy to say he was one of thirty that was selected to be on that committee.

Supervisor Jim Gillio thanked them for the report and congratulated him for being selected for that committee, that is going to be a big impact for us locally.

Supervisor Anthony Botelho echoed Supervisor Gillio. He said that we do have a great partnership with Santa Cruz Area for Aging.
