- 1. Chair Mark Medina called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Those present were Executive Officer Bill Nicholson and Commissioners: Cesar Flores, Mark Medina, Richard Bettencourt, and Ignacio Velazquez. Also present were Reed Gallogly, LAFCO Counsel, and Janet Slibsager, Recording Secretary.
- 2. Commissioner Bettencourt led the Pledge of Allegiance.

BUSINESS ITEMS- PUBLIC HEARING ITEMS

6. LAFCO 533 – Gonzalez Annexation No. 2 to the City of Hollister: Involving the annexation of approximately 12.1 acres of property into the City for future residential development. The property is located on the north side of Buena Vista Road, north of the extension of Vista View Lane, and approximately 500 feet west of Gonzales Drive (Assessor's Parcel Number 019-110-031). The actions requested are to make a determination that the Commission has reviewed and considered the City's Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration prepared by the City of Hollister, and that there are no mitigation measures for the Commission to adopt, and to approve the annexation, and authorize LAFCO staff to complete the proceedings without further notice, hearing or election.

Executive Officer Bill Nicholson provided information on the proposal to annex 12.1 acres into the City for future residential development and a presentation showing the maps. Mr. Nicholson provided the history and the acreage was part of the Gonzalez/Borelli initial study prepared by the City in 2016. Presented was map 1 of the annexation boundary and map 2 of the Hollister sphere of influence, and a site photo identifying the location of an existing domestic and agricultural well serving neighboring properties.

Discussion was held between Mr. Nicholson and Commissioners Bettencourt and Chair Medina regarding what the maps were displaying. Specific location of the well site and correspondence from the neighboring property owner, Linda Gomes, was held regarding the water lines and water well that provides water to the current homes and farmland. Mr. Nicholson is asking for a commitment letter to be sent from the applicant to the responsible party to insure in writing that they continue to offer maintaining the water supply.

Mr. Nicholson provided information on the City's environmental review and stated that LAFCO reviewed the study and there are is no mitigation measures to adopt by the Commission.

Mr. Nicholson presented staff's recommendation to approve the annexation, acknowledge the Commission reviewed the environmental review and study prepared by the City, and that there are no mitigation measures required by LAFCO, and adopt Resolution Number 533 approving the annexation of approximately 12.1 acres based on the 10 determinations on page 2 through 6 of the Executive Officer's Report.

Chair Medina opened public comment.

No one from the public wished to speak.

Commissioner Bettencourt made a motion to approve option #1 based on the determinations in the Report and subject to the two conditions of approval, seconded by Commissioner Flores seconded.

7. Commissioner Announcements and Requests for Future Agenda Items

Commissioner Bettencourt spoke about the general plan update with the City of Hollister.

Chairman Medina asked Commissioner Velazquez the time frame for the general plan.

Commissioner Velazquez responded in 18 months to two years.

Commissioner Bettencourt would like to know what his fellow commission would like to do about the concerns with protecting prime agricultural land. Discussion was held with Commissioners and Mr. Nicholson regarding issues and concerns with protecting prime agricultural prime land.

Commissioner Bettencourt would like to see this topic on a future agenda item.

8. LAFCO Counsel oral report on question regarding the Executive Officer's Contract raised at the May 14, 20202 Commission Meeting

Reed Gallogly from County Counsel provided a summary on the labor code and it does not apply to a public agency, LAFCO is a public agency.

Chairman Medina asked Mr. Gallogly if they need anything in writing stating that Mr. Nicholson is satisfied with the arrangement that he has.

Mr. Gallogly responded that adding in language for the next contract and getting it in writing will be beneficial.

Commissioner Bettencourt asked if LAFCO would be better protected if Mr. Nicholson was incorporated.

Mr. Gallogly provided information that it would not matter if he incorporated, and that modification to the contract would resolve it.

9. Executive Officer oral status report on pending proposals

Executive Officer Bill Nicholson discussed upcoming applications and is getting the pieces together for review of an annexation of an affordable housing project to County Service Area No. 53 and hopes to have it ready for the August meeting. In July a farm worker housing proposal, off Southside Road may come to the Commission for determination for exemption for a sewer and water extension from the City of Hollister. Mr. Nicholson discussed the City Council meeting that The City of Hollister talked about having a new manager of the City sewer plant.

Commissioner Velazquez said that the City is not looking into giving up management and ownership of the plant. The operations would be put out to bid to allow Sunnyslope County Water District to operate the plant but would not be looking for a partnership.



Consideration of Exemption from Government Code 56133(e)(4) for the San Benito County Farm Labor Association Container Housing Project (Agenda Item 5)

Dear Members of the Commission:

RECOMMENDATION

Direct the Commission Chair to sign a letter to the City of Hollister verifying that their use of existing sewer and water connections from the City of Hollister for the proposed converted container migrant housing project at 3235 Southside Road is exempt from LAFCO approval under Government Code section 56133(e)(4).

DISCUSSION

As the Commission is aware, Government Code section 56133(a) requires Commission review and approval of service extensions by a city or special district to property located outside their city or district boundary. Under this section of the Government Code, there are specific criteria for granting approval along with several exemptions from LAFCO review and approval.

In coordination with Danny Hillstock, City Engineer for the City of Hollister, along with Greg Swett and Mary Lou Coffelt with the nonprofit San Benito County Farm Labor Association, San Benito LAFCO has been requested to provide a letter confirming that the proposed 10 bedroom and five bathroom migrant housing project consisting of converted storage containers located on the site of the County Migrant Farmworker Housing complex is exempt from LAFCO approval for an out of agency boundary sewer and water connection from the City of Hollister. Specifically, the request is for the Commission to determine that the project complies with the exemption from LAFCO review and approval under Government Code section 56133(e)(4): "An extended service that a city or district was providing before January 1, 2001."

The location of the Migrant Farmlabor Housing Complex is presented in the attached regional map and aerial photo, with the proposed housing units consisting of converted storage containers being located along the eastern property line. These units are also identified in the attached Site Plan and Floor Plan.

To support this exemption, Mr. Hillstock and City staff have provided historic utility billing statements to the County owned property at 3235 Southside Road which indicate water service has been provided to the property by the City since October 1973, and sewer service has been provided since the 1990's. Also, based on City Finance Department records, there have been at least four housing units that were disconnected from City utility services in 2016, which would provide evidence that the requested connections do not increase the historic capacity of service to the migrant farmworker housing complex.

The following City Finance Department Account details were identified by Becky Quezada in the City Finance Department, regarding active and disconnected sewer and water accounts:

Account 371-1448 Migrant Camp

Water: 1 meter serving 42 units; Size 2&5/8' meter size.

Rate: \$78.95 base rate charge for high consumption and \$13.29 for low consumption.

Sewer: 42 units

Rate: Monthly charge is $$70.07 \times 42 = $2,942.94$.

City Billing Start Date: 10/14/2015

Account 371-1445 Men's camp

Water: 1 meter for 2 dormitory units; Size 2' meter size.

Rate: \$78.95, plus consumption at \$4.39

Sewer: 2 units dormitory units monthly charge \$70.07 x 2 = \$140.14

Property might have detached shower/bathroom area and a large kitchen/eating area separate

from the dormitory structures. City Billing Start Date: 3/3/1995

Account 371-1445 Mobile homes

Water: 1 meter for 10 mobile home units; Size 2'meter.

Rate: \$78.95, plus consumption at \$4.39

Sewer: 10 units monthly charge is \$49.17 x 10 = \$491.70

Evidence of former connections that have been disconnected at the same address is provided in a copy of a printout of the Hollister Finance Department utility Account No. 371-1435. This document identifies that three units were disconnected from water and one unit for sewer on February 16, 2016. While there is no information on the level of consumption for water or sewer for these units, Staff is comfortable that the historic level of service would be approximately the same as required for the small housing quarters proposed in the current converted container housing project which will accommodate a maximum of 20 occupants.


In conclusion, LAFCo Staff supports the determination that the City of Hollister provided both sewer and water service to the migrant farmlabor facility at 3235 Southside Road prior to January 1, 2001, and the new request does not represent an increase from historic service levels.



Dear Mr. Hillstock:

The Commission reviewed the City's request for San Benito LAFCO review of the proposed sewer and water extension to the 10 bedroom project involving converted container units located at the Couty Migrant Farmlabor Housing Center at 3235 Southside Road. At the July 9, 2020, regular meeting, the Commission voted to find the service extension qualified as an exemption from Commission reiew under Government Code section 56133(e)(4): "An extended service that a city or district was providing before January 1, 2001."

This determination was based on the information provided by the City which verified the historic sewer and water service provided to the site by the City well before 2001, and evidence that the City was not increasing the level of service to the property as a result of the disconnection of service to former housing units in February 2016 (Former Account No. 371-1435).

This letter serves as notice that the LAFCO of San Benito County has determined the connections to the existing City of Hollister sewer and water lines to the proposed converted container farmlabor housing project at 3235 Southside Road is exempt from the Commission's review and approval.
