

I am pleased to submit this 2001 Crop Report for San Benito County, which indicates agricultural and livestock production values.

Agriculture continues to be the county's major producing industry with a 2001 gross value of \$208,718,000. This total is a slight decrease of less than 1% from the 2000 total.

The most significant change was Nursery Stock moved to the #1 crop in the County bringing in just over \$25 million, and the category of Other Livestock/Livestock & Poultry Products showed a substantial increased of 57% due mainly to an increase in both production and price of Milk and increased production of Turkey eggs.

San Benito County's 2001 agricultural income of nearly 209 million dollars again shows an important contribution to the county's economic base and the quality of life of it's residents.

Please bear in mind that these figures are for gross income only, and not net profit to the grower. In some cases, crops are actually produced at a loss.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the many growers and handlers of agricultural products, and personnel of other governmental agencies for their assistance in obtaining these figures; without their help, this report would not have been possible. I would also like to acknowledge my staff, and in particular Paul Matulich & Sally Boden who compiled this report.
