Record Retention Requirements for Headquarter Inspections

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Purpose of Headquarters Inspection

This inspection is to determine whether employers who have employees handling pesticides comply with applicable worker safety requirements and to determine compliance of growers

Records

3 CCR § 6412 Restricted Material Permit Requirements

- Valid Restricted Materials Permit for materials used and reported
- Valid permit for materials stored/possessed.

3 CCR § 6622 Operator Identification Number

Operator Identification Number obtained prior to purchase or use:

- Agricultural use pesticides
- Industrial post-harvest commodity treatment
- Pesticide listed in section 6800(b) for any outdoor institutional or outdoor industrial use.

The operator of the property shall retain a copy of each restricted material permit or form for

TWO YEARS

Operator Identification Number or Restricted Material with Site ID numbers kept for two years 3 CCR § 6619

Applications

The records required pursuant to this section must be retained for

TWO YEARS

The operator of the property must maintain a written record of the applications on their property.

3 CCR § 6619 Notice of Completed Applications

The records required pursuant to this section must be retained for

TWO YEARS

This record must include:

- 1. Location and description of treated field
- 2. The pesticide name, EPA Registration No., and active ingredient(s)
- 3. Spray adjuvant names and registration number
- 4. Dates and times the application started and ended
- 5. Any applicable reentry and preharvest intervals

3 CCR 6624 Pesticide Use Records

The records required pursuant to this section must be retained for

TWO YEARS

- Maintain records of pesticide use
- Includes applications performed by PCB's

3 CCR § 6726 and 6766. Emergency Medical Care

Emergency medical care for employees handling pesticides or who enter fields that have been treated with pesticides shall be planned for in advance.

3 CCR § 6726 and 6766. Emergency Medical Care Employers must provide the following to medical personnel treating an employee for suspected pesticide exposure:

- (1)Safety Data Sheet (SDS), product name, EPA registration number and active ingredient(s)
- (2) The circumstances of application of use of the pesticide.
- (3) The circumstances that could have resulted in exposure to the pesticide.

3 CCR § 6726 and 6766. Emergency Medical Care

When there are *reasonable* grounds to suspect that an employee has a pesticide illness, or when an exposure to a pesticide has occurred that might reasonably be expected to lead to an employee's illness, the employer shall ensure that the employee is taken to a physician immediately.

3 CCR § 6784(b) Field Fumigation

The employer shall maintain these use records at a central location for

TWO YEARS

Methyl Bromide Records

- Records for employees performing fumigation handling activities
- The records must identify the person, work activity, date, duration of handling, EPA Registration Number, and the brand name of the methyl bromide product handled.

3 CCR § 6724(b)-(e) Handler Training

The employer shall maintain a copy of the training program while in use and for

TWO YEARS

after use, at a central location at the workplace.

Written training programs must:

- Describe the materials used to train (e.g., study guides, PSIS leaflets, SDS's, etc.)
- Identify the person or firm that provides the training.

3 CCR § 6764 Fieldworker Training

This record shall be retained by the employer for

TWO YEARS

at a central location at the workplace accessible to employees. The record must be provided to the employee upon request.

The record of initial and annually required training given to the employee must include:

- Date
- Employee's printed name and signature
- Title and source of training materials used
- Employer's name
- Trainers name and qualification

Handler Training and Fieldworker Training

The person conducting the training shall be qualified as ...

- (1) A California certified commercial applicator;
- (2) A California certified private applicator;
- (3) A person holding a valid County Biologist License in Pesticide Regulation or Investigation and Environmental Monitoring issued by the Department of Food and Agriculture;
- (4) A University of California Extension Advisor;
- (5) A person who has completed an "instructor training" program presented by one of the following:
- (A) the University of California, Integrated Pest Management Program; or
- (B) other instructor training program approved by the Director;
- (6) A California licensed Agricultural Pest Control Adviser;
- (7) A California Registered Professional Forester; or
- (8) Other trainer qualification approved by the Director.

Records maintained

THREE YEARS

Written Respiratory Protection Program

- Procedure for selecting respirator
- Medical evaluations
- Fit test procedures
- Procedures for proper use
- Procedures and schedules for cleaning, disinfecting, storing, inspecting, repairing, discarding, or other maintenance

Records maintained

THREE YEARS

Written Respiratory Protection Program

- Procedures to ensure adequate air quality, quantity, and flow of breathing air for atmosphere supplying respirators
- Training of employees in the respiratory hazards to which they are potentially exposed during routine and emergency situations
- Training in the proper use of respirators, including putting on and removing them
- Procedures for evaluating the effectiveness of the program

Records maintained

THREE YEARS

Fit Test Records

Records required by this section shall be maintained while the employee is required to use respiratory protection and for three years after the end of employment conditions requiring respiratory protection

THREE YEARS

Fit Test Records

Record of qualitative and quantitative fit test:

- Name or identification of the employee tested
- ❖ Type of fit test
- Specific respirator tested (make, model, style, size)
- ❖ Date of Test
- ❖ Pass / Fail

3 CCR § 6728 Medical Supervision

Records required by this Section shall be maintained for

THREE YEARS

Whenever an employee mixes, loads, or applies a pesticide with the signal work "DANGER" or "WARNING" that contains an organophosphate or carbamate...
