I am pleased to submit this 1990 Crop Report for San Benito County, as required by Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code.

The 1990 gross value of production was up over five million dollars which is in excess of 4.5 percent more from 1989. The dramatic increase was in the category of vegetable and row crops and within that grouping, head lettuce acreage and value accounts for the majority of the gain. The field crops category declined over 3.7 million dollars. The categories of livestock products, fruit and nut crops, and poultry also had lower gross incomes.

I would like to stress that these figures are for gross income only, not net profit to the grower. In some cases, crops are actually produced at a loss.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the many growers and handlers of agricultural products, and personnel of other governmental agencies for their assistance in obtaining these figures; without their help, this report would not have been possible. I would also like to acknowledge my staff, and in particular Paul Matulich who compiled this report.
