## Redistricting Rules and Goals

#### 1. Federal Laws

- Equal Population
   Max. population deviation = <10%</li>
- Federal Voting Rights Act
- No Racial Gerrymandering



#### 2. California Criteria for Counties

- 1. Geographically contiguous
- 2. Undivided neighborhoods and "communities of interest"

(Socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)

- 3. Cities and Census Designated Places Integrity Respected
- 4. Easily identifiable boundaries
- **5. Compact** (Not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)

"Shall not favor or discriminate against a political party."

## 3. Other Traditional Redistricting Principles

- Minimize voters shifted to different election years
- Respect voters' choices / continuity in office
- Future population growth
- Preserving the core of existing districts

## Constitutional & Federal Voting Rights Act Considerations

14<sup>th</sup> Amendment Equal Protection; *Baker v. Carr* (1962) 369 U.S. 186; *Reynolds v. Sims* (1964) 377 U.S. 533; *Avery v. Midland County* (1968) 390 U.S. 474: Voting Rights Act of 1965 as amended in 1982 (52 U.S.C. § 10301);

Equal Protection Principle: Electoral districts must be roughly equal in population – "one person, one vote"

VRA Section 2 "results test" prohibits any voting practice that has a discriminatory effect, whether or not enacted or administered for the purpose of discriminating, including drawing electoral districts that dilute the votes of protected racial or language minorities.

- "Packing" -- concentrating protected classes in districts to dilute voting power for representation in elected body in proportion to population
- "Cracking" dividing protected classes between districts so as to frustrate opportunity for electoral success within any district

No "racial gerrymandering" - May not prioritize racial considerations over traditional redistricting principles, which include compactness, contiguity, and respect for political subdivisions or communities defined by actual shared interests.

No right to election equal to proportion in population.



## Neighborhoods/Communities of Interest

#### Neighborhoods

- 1. What is your neighborhood?
- 2. What are its geographic boundaries?

In the absence of public testimony, planning records and other similar documents may provide definition.

#### Communities of Interest

- 1. What defines your community?
- 2. Would this community benefit from being "included within a single district for purposes of its effective and fair representation"?

Communities of Interest may <u>not</u> include relationships with political parties, incumbents, or political candidates.



## Alternative Map: NDC2









Adopt supervisorial district boundaries and map on December 14 in consideration of:

- Equal population (<10% deviation)
- Complies with Voting Rights Act
- No racial / language gerrymandering
- Contiguous
- Undivided neighborhoods communities of interest
- Integrity of Cities & CDPs (e.g. Aromas, Ridgmark, Tres Pinos, etc.) respected
- Easily identifiable boundaries (roads, natural barriers, etc.)
- Compact
- Preserves core of existing districts
